

## Call for Nominations

### 2015 Hendrik C. van de Hulst Light-Scattering Award

We are very pleased to solicit nominations for the *2015 Van de Hulst Light-Scattering Award* presented by Elsevier.

This high-profile Award is meant to celebrate the *lifetime achievements* of an individual scientist who has made *landmark contributions* to the research field of electromagnetic scattering and its applications. On behalf of Elsevier, the Award is administered by the Editorial Board and Publisher of the *Journal of Quantitative Spectroscopy and Radiative Transfer (JQSRT)*. Nominations of scientists of all nationalities and all ages will be considered.

Each nomination (as a single PDF file) must consist of a nomination letter, the nominee's CV and publications list, and at least three letters of support.

This prestigious Elsevier Award has been presented biennially since 2011 in honor of Prof. Hendrik C. van de Hulst's monumental achievements in the discipline of light scattering. The *Journal of Quantitative Spectroscopy and Radiative Transfer*, to which Prof. van de Hulst had contributed prominently, encourages the publication of high-quality manuscripts in the areas of electromagnetic scattering, radiative transfer, and quantitative spectroscopy. Each winner of the Award is expected to publish in *JQSRT* a "Van de Hulst Essay" placing his/her research in the general context of electromagnetic scattering and its applications.

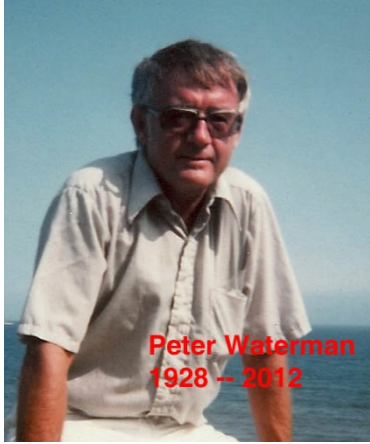

### 2014 and 2015 Elsevier/*JQSRT* Peter C. Waterman Awards

This prestigious Elsevier/*JQSRT* young-scientist award is named after *Peter C. Waterman* (1928–2012) whose ground-breaking research has had a dramatic and long-lasting impact and to a large degree has guided the progress in the disciplines of electromagnetic, acoustic, and elastic wave scattering by obstacles.

The 2014 and 2015 Waterman Awards will be competed among early-career scientists who work on the theory and applications of *Electromagnetic Scattering*. Both *Awards* will be presented at the 15th Electromagnetic and Light Scattering Conference (*ELS-XV*) which will be held in Leipzig, Germany 21–26 June 2015. Each award will consist of a certificate and a USD 750 monetary prize.

To qualify for consideration, a nominee:

- Must be a graduate or post-graduate student or in his/her early career path with an outstanding record of scholarship;
- Must have not received a *JQSRT* Young Scientist Award previously;
- Should have published in *JQSRT* previously, although this requirement may be relaxed in exceptional cases;
- Should be under 37 years of age on 21 June 2015 or finished his/her PhD within the 10 years preceding that date;
- Must present at least one paper at *ELS-XV*;
- Must attend the award ceremony at *ELS-XV*.

The recipients of the 2014 and 2015 Waterman Awards will be selected by a distinguished Award Committee and announced at the *ELS-XV* conference banquet.

Both nominations and self-nominations will be considered. This newly established Elsevier/*JQSRT* young-scientist award is named after *Richard M. Goody* (born 1921) whose pioneering research has had a profound and long-lasting impact on the disciplines of atmospheric radiation, remote sensing, and climate change.

The 2014 and 2015 Goody Awards will be competed among early-career scientists who work in the fields of *Atmospheric Radiation and Remote Sensing*. Both Awards will be presented at the 15th Electromagnetic and Light Scattering Conference (*ELS-XV*) which will be held in Leipzig, Germany 21–26 June 2015. Each award will consist of a certificate and a USD 750 monetary prize.

To qualify for consideration, a nominee:

- Must be a graduate or post-graduate student or in his/her early career path with an outstanding record of scholarship;
